Public Utility Easement Waiver

We (I), _____, are (am) the owner of property identified at parcel number _____ and legal description* (provided on the attached), located in Maricopa County, Arizona. We, (I) have applied for a permit to construct a fence/wall/gate that is to be located, in whole or in part, in or across a recorded easement that encumbers my property. We (I) have read, understand, and agree to the following:

- 1. The easement located on my property gives certain rights to the holder of that easement.
2. The land on which the easement is located remains my property; however, all of my rights to use that land are subject to the terms and conditions of the easement.
3. We (I) have applied for a permit to construct a fence/wall/gate that will be located, in whole or in part, on the portion of my property encumbered by the easement.
4. Maricopa County, through the Department of Planning and Development, has agreed to issue a permit for the fence in the location we (I) have chosen.
5. We (I) understand that the holder of the easement has the right to knock down, remove or destroy any and all portions of the fence/wall/gate located within the easement if it is necessary to do so to carry out the purpose of the easement.
6. We (I) understand that should the holder of the easement knock down, remove or destroy any portion of the fence/wall/gate in furtherance of the purpose of the easement, it will be solely my responsibility to repair or replace the fence and there will be no responsibility on the part of the holder of the easement to do so.
7. We (I) understand that the issuance of the permit for the fence/wall/gate by Maricopa County does not constitute permission of any kind to interfere with the easement.
8. We (I) do hereby waive and forever give up any claim of any nature whatsoever we, (I) have or may have in the future related to the issuance of a fence permit for my fence/wall/gate which is located, in whole or in part, within the easement that encumbers my property.
9. We (I) agree that this waiver shall run with the land and shall be binding upon me and all successors in title to the property. To insure this waiver runs with the land we (I) agree that, prior to the issuance of any permit for the fence/wall/gate, a copy of this waiver shall be recorded in the office of the Recorder of Maricopa County, at my expense.
10. ARS§ 11-480.D states that "Any instrument presented to a county recorder for recordation which modifies in any way the provisions of a previously recorded document must state the date of recordation and the docket and page of the document being modified." 


